Responsibilities of Trustees of the Horsham Society

When an individual is elected to the Executive Committee of the Horsham Society, they automatically become a Trustee of the Horsham Society, which is a registered charity. For this reason, any member of the Executive Committee must satisfy the following requirements.

- 1 He / she must be at least 18 years old.
- 2 He / she must not suffer from a mental incapacity.
- 3 He / she must not have an ulterior motive, whether this is for political, commercial or private benefit.
- 4 He / she must not have been convicted of offences involving deception or dishonesty, unless the convictions are spent.
- 5 He / she must not have been disqualified from acting as a company director or have been removed involuntarily from previous charity trusteeships.
- 6 He / she must not have been made bankrupt or entered into a voluntary arrangement with creditors.

In addition, trustees must accept that:

- 7 all decisions are taken on a simple majority vote with the casting vote being held by the chairman
- 8 all trustees are bound by a decision properly taken, however they may have voted
- 9 attendance at meetings is one of the main duties of a trustee and someone, whose other commitments do not permit regular attendance, should not be a trustee.
